Three new upholstery textiles—*Mass*, *Merge*, and *Points*—focus on texture and dimension in luxe constructions. The winner of the NYCxDESIGN Award for *Fabrics: Contract*, MATTER celebrates complexity through the use of random forms, rogue lines, and shifting layers that are new to contract fabrics. Natural wool and cotton, polyester, and metallic yarns are blended to bring an elegant, residential feel to workplace and hospitality interiors. Harmonious colorways across the collection of twenty items enable designers to experiment with MATTER's scale changes. This acclaimed collection debuts at the Wolf-Gordon Showroom, Suite 10-161, during NeoCon® 2018.
